The jewel in Hull's cultural crown taking place over nine days, **Freedom Festival** (26th Aug – 4th Sep) returns this month with its award-winning international arts festival. Expect crowd-pleasing spectaculars to intimate and thought-provoking performances inspired by modern-day themes of freedom. Check out the full programme, which includes the premiere of a brand-new exhibition from Australian artist Joanna Dudley at **Ferens Art Gallery** alongside only two other galleries in the world (New York and Sydney). On Thursday evenings, head to **Trinity Market** in Hull's Old Town for **Trinity Live**, a free showcase of live music by up and coming acts.

Pop your clogs on and join in with traditional folk dancing in the cobbled streets by Hull Marina and the Old Fruit Market areas for **Maritime Festival 2022** (9th – 11th Sept). If you fancy taking a food trip around the world, supping up at a real ale warehouse and seeing and hearing the sounds of folk music around every corner, this one's for you.



Save the date for the largest heritage festival in England with **Heritage Open Days**, which are back (9th – 18th Sept) with thousands of free events for you to enjoy.

Experience a fascinating glimpse into Victorian times, a genuine 2,600 year old Egyption mummy and unique replicas of King Tutankhamen's treasures at **Hands on History Museum** (13th and 27th Aug, 10th Sept). Here you'll discover the story of Hull and its people in the old Grammar School, where William Wilberforce, leader of the movement to abolish the slave trade, studied.

Been a while since you've journeyed underwater at the world's only submarium? It's 20 years since **The Deep** opened so come party with the penguins while you explore one of the world's most spectacular aquariums. And if you love your visit and want to come again, your day pass is valid for 12 months so you can get under the sea as often as you like.

Ready for a laugh? After popular demand, comedian **Kevin Bridges** will be staying in Hull for an extra night this month! Along with his visit to the Bonus Arena on Friday 12th and Saturday 13th August, Kevin will extend his run to a third evening on Sunday 14th August.

A city rooted in Freedom

Freedom Festival was established as part of the 2007 William Wilberforce commemorations,

celebrating the bicentenary of the 1807 abolition of the slave trade. Since then the festival has continued to celebrate the important issues of freedom through a programme of dance, theatre, circus, spoken word, debates and talks, using art to raise awareness of important issues from modern-day slavery to protest, sustainability and equality.

Emerging talend

Since 2012 **Humber Street Sesh** has provided a powerful platform for the emerging artists of the region. By 2019, the event saw a stellar line up of UK talent like The Hunna, The Blinders and Yonaka.
