Hello September! It's the beginning of a new season, a new school year and a month brimming with possibilities.

As the last days of summer collide with autumn, there's a different feeling in the air. In Hull, that feeling is electric.

A city full of possibilities, it's ready to welcome you with open arms (with or without the kids) to seize the last moments of summer and embrace the seasonal shift and crisp autumn days.

A city steeped in history, there really is something for everyone to enjoy. A perfectly sized city to explore on foot, discover Hull's hidden secrets (and some that aren't so hidden!) on one of the city's many walking trails. From ale to poetry, this fascinating place has the trail for you.

Learn more about Hull's seafaring past at the **Heritage Open Days**, which take place from 9th to 18th September or discover 800 years of maritime heritage through the buildings, stories and people of the city with a 2.4km **Maritime Tour**. Delivered by our White Badge accredited volunteers, the morning tours begin in the **Museum Quarter Peace Gardens** on High Street, taking in **Queens Gardens**, the exterior of the **Maritime Museum** and the future locations of the **Spurn Lightship** in Hull Marina and **Arctic Corsair** in the Northend Shipyard.

Why not feast your eyes on what has long been regarded as one of Hull's best kept secrets, **Hull Trinity House**. With its doors now open to the public and a history dating back to 1369 when Hull was still a developing town, you're in for a treat as you discover what lies behind its imposing facade. Book yourself a tour to see rare and valued artefacts, including nautical memorabilia, furniture, artworks and treasures from around the globe.

If you like a good view, head to **Hull Minster Tour** to experience a panoramic view of the city from the highest public access point. In one of its free tours, learn about the bells of the Minster and see the clock mechanism in action as you ascend the 180 steps to the ringing chamber. Once you have reached the top of the tower you will have an unparalleled vantage point across the East Yorkshire Wolds, Humber Estuary, Holderness area and north to Beverley.

Want to grab a front row seat? It must be Hull.

The start of autumn is the perfect time to make plans and Hull's theatres and entertainment venues have an eclectic programme of artists waiting for you this season.

September's a busy month at the **Bonus Arena**. Book your tickets now to see the stars with **Professor Brian Cox** (14th and 15th September) or if superstars are more your thing, check out **The Official RuPaul's Drag Race UK Series 3 Tour** (17th September) while

Alan Carr returns (23rd and 24th September) with **Not Again, Alan!** and on 30th September, the stage plays host to **Katherine Ryan: Missus**.

Hull City Hall's September programme includes **Steve Hackett Genesis Revisited** (20th September), comedy legend Glenn Moore is back with **Glenn Moore: Will You Still Need Me** (22nd September), **Whitney: Queen of the Night** (24th September), **Imagine: The John Lennon Songbook** (28th September) and **10CC** (30th September).

This month, **Hull New Theatre** welcomes **Bat Out Of Hull** (13th to 24th September), while **Beardyman** (22nd September) and **Tom Sade** (30th September) play at Hull's independent venue **Social** on Humber Street.

Grab a ticket to see **Ladies Unleashed**, which opens at **Hull Truck Theatre** (29th September to 22nd October). Following the smash-hits Ladies Day and Ladies Down Under, Amanda Whittington brings us the third in the Ladies Trilogy. Don't miss this moving comedy about friendship, growing older and living for today. Directed by Mark Babych.

On Thursday evenings, head to **Trinity Market** in Hull's Old Town for **Trinity Live**, a free showcase of live music by up and coming acts.

For cosy pubs and tipples for all tastes... It must be Hull.

For Hull isn't short of welcoming pubs, bars and coffee shops. So sit back with a locally brewed ale, artisan gin or gourmet coffee (whatever your tittle of choice).

Discover the full flavour of the city at **Trinity Market**. Like a serving of music or comedy with your food, check out their website for details of **Trinity Live** events.

Try and find the smallest window in England at the **George Hotel**, look up to count the beer mats at **The Lion and Key** or visit **The Minerva** for a Sunday dinner with views of the Humber.


